**CONSENT MOTION FOR RELIEF FROM PROTECTIVE ORDER**

The defendant, Thomas Drake, through his attorneys, hereby moves this Honorable Court for an Order granting partial relief from the Protective Order governing unclassified information that was entered in this case by consent of the parties on April 29, 2010. *See* Docket No. 13. The Protective Order provides that unclassified discovery may be disclosed only in connection with the criminal proceedings, but it allows that the Court may enter an Order permitting the disclosure of unclassified discovery beyond the criminal case. *See* Protective Order ¶ 4. The defense respectfully requests an Order of the Court that permits defense expert witness, J. William Leonard, the former Director of the Information Security Oversight Office (ISOO), to file a formal letter of complaint to the current Director of ISOO, John P. Fitzpatrick, regarding the government's decision to classify and its reasons for classification of the document charged in Count One of the Indictment, entitled "What a Success." During the criminal case, the government took the position that the "What a Success" document was classified at the "Secret" level when it was found on Mr. Drake's home computer and at the time of the Indictment in April 2010. The National Security Agency declassified the document in July 2010. The now-unclassified "What a Success" document, as well as the government's unclassified expert witness summaries, were shared with Mr. Leonard during the criminal proceedings. If this case had gone to trial, Mr. Leonard was prepared to testify that the "What a Success" document did not contain

classified information and never should have been classified. His complaint to the Director of ISOO regarding the document is based on the unclassified information he received as an expert witness pursuant to the Protective Order. As a result, the defense is seeking an Order of the Court allowing him to disclose the unclassified information for the purpose of filing a complaint with ISOO and to discuss the issues raised in his complaint with any investigating authorities. The government consents to the relief requested in this motion.

WHEREFORE, Thomas Drake respectfully moves this Court for an Order granting J. William Leonard permission to submit his complaint regarding the “What a Success” document to ISOO Director John P. Fitzpatrick and to discuss the issues raised in the complaint with the complaint’s recipients and any other government officials who may respond to the complaint or investigate the matter.
