Dear Mr. Aftergood:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") request dated December 18, 2007. We have searched the files of the Office of Legal Counsel and have found one document that is responsive to your request. We are withholding the document in full because it is classified and thus exempt under Exemption 1 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(1), and because it contains information of the type described in Section 6 of the National Security Act of 1959, Pub. L. No. 86-36, § 6, 73 Stat. 63, 64, codified at 50 U.S.C. § 402 note, and in Section 102A(i)(1) of the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004, 50 U.S.C. § 403-1(i)(1), and is thus exempt under Exemption 3 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3). In addition, the document is subject to the deliberative process and attorney-client privileges and thus is also withheld under Exemption 5, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5).

If you are not satisfied with my action on this request, you may appeal by writing to the Director, Office of Information and Privacy, United States Department of Justice, Washington, D.C. 20530, within 60 days from the date of this letter. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act.

We request a copy of an Office of Legal Counsel opinion from the George W. Bush Administration pertaining in part to the efficacy of executive orders.

In particular, Senator Sheldon Whitehouse stated on the Senate floor on December 7 that he had examined an OLC opinion which included, according to his notes, the following statement or something resembling it:

“An Executive order cannot limit a President. There is no constitutional requirement for a President to issue a new Executive order whenever he wishes to depart from the terms of a previous Executive order. Rather than violate an Executive order, the President has instead modified or waived it.”

We request a copy of the OLC opinion referenced by Sen. Whitehouse.
